Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two auctions in the year - March and October.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders the week after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

1. The Lord's Taverners Fifty Greatest. The following have **signed** to their illustration Gavaskar, Underwood, Knott and Bedser. The following are awaiting a signature Worrell, Grout, and Sobers. The remainder, (43), have laid down signatures associated with their illustration. The book is in very good condition and not far from completion as far as signatures are concerned.

A very good copy of the study of the lithographs of John Corbett Anderson with laid down signatures of the authors. **Sold with** a very good copy of *Cricket Cartoons and Caricatures* by George Plumptre, a collection and analysis of the art over two centuries.

3. Bradman Stamps. A very attractive framed and glazed presentation of the Bradman stamps as issued in connection with "Australian Legends". There is a **laid down signature** of Bradman beneath the stamp display. The overall size of the display is 41 x 32cms, it can be viewed from both sides and is in very good condition.

Good **(4) Thanks to Cricket by J M Kilburn.** 1st edition with dw (featuring the Scarborough ground), 1972. Excellent Est. £6/10

18. The Ashes Thrown Away by E M Wellings. 1st edition in dw in protective covering, 1959. Covers the Ashes Tour of 1958/59. Good++ Est. £3/5

19. Twenty20 Vision – My Life and Inspiration by Mushtaq Ahmed. 1st edition in dw, 2006 with signed dedication “To Oliver etc”. Mint Est. £8/12

20. Ins and Outs by Norman O’Neill. 1st edition in dw with minor wear, 1964. VG Est. £3/5

21. Two John Arlott books. (1) Concerning Cricket. New impression 1950 (1st edition published 1949), no dw. Gilt to spine is bright. VG thus. **(2) The Middle Ages of Cricket.** 1st edition, no dw, 1949. The book contains sections from Denison’s *Sketches of the Players* and Pycroft’s *Cricket Recollections* from *Oxford Memories*, these pieces having been assembled, edited and discussed by Arlott. VG thus Est. £4/6

- 22. Cricket Calling by Roland Ryder.** 1st edition with dw, 1995. As new Est. £4/6
- 23. The Trundlers – The military medium-paced story of cricket’s most invaluable breed by Harry Pearson.** 1st edition in soft card covers (nothing to say it was issued as a hardback). 2013. Winner of the MCC Book of the Year. As new Est. £2/3
- 24. Warwickshire magazine – Beyond the Boundary.** Issues nos. 1-9 (2003-05) of ‘the new-look BTB’. All in excellent condition Est. £3/5
- 25. Printer’s block – Wainwright cricket bat advert.** This is a block for S M Wainwright Ltd of Leeds Bridge, Leeds 1. The top of the block – below which is a cricketer effecting a classic stroke (difficult to tell to where, being the opposite way round!) – says “Craftsman-made cricket bats for discriminating players”. It measures 22.5 x 16cms and is 2cms thick. Whether or not this is a unique item is open to question, but there can’t be many about. VG Est. £8/12
- 26. Wooden shield** with a raised shield with a coat of arms. Above the smaller shield is a banner style sash “Captain Cook Bicentennial Tour 1978”. The similar style banner below has “Vancouver Island Vagabonds CC”. It measures approx 18 x 15cms. Unusual. VG Est. £4/6
- 27. Surrey caricature print.** A framed and glazed caricature by the well-known Fred May. This is titled “Glorious Old Surrey!” and at the bottom “Some of the Shock Troops – by Fred May”. The players featured are : Bert Geary, Mac Ducat, Percy Fender, Barney Wilson, W Barnato, Andy Sandham, Jack Hobbs, ‘Darkie’ Lock, Tom Shepherd, Tom Barling, Bob Gregory and Ed Brooks. There is no date, but research indicates it’s a Surrey team from 1928 - 1930. It measures 21.5 x 26.5 cms. VG+ Est. £8/12
- 28. Box of mixed ephemera.** Includes signed photo (b&w) of Nasser Hussain; Zimbabwe 1982 autograph sheet; a *Sunday Times* wallchart celebrating 200 years of cricket complete with all 40 stickers; four Scarborough CC annual reports; Jack Davey and David Shepherd Testimonial souvenir; Worcestershire Year Book 1955; *Cricket Spotlight* 1971; Yorkshire CCC Year Book 1919 (some faults), and various other tour brochures etc. Condition varies between poor and excellent, most being VG Est. £12/25
- 29. Mike Procter and Cricket.** A 1981 autobiography **signed** by Procter on the title page. The book and dust jacket are in very good condition. Est. £5/8
- 30. A Right Ambition by David Gower.** Not an autobiography but an analysis of various aspects of the game and the leading players. **Signed** by Gower on the title page. The book and dust jacket are in very good condition. Est. £5/8
- 31. Cricket Umpiring by David Constant.** A review of umpiring skills and experiences together with assessments of some of the game’s leading players. Constant has **signed** on the title page. The book and dust jacket are in very good condition. Est. £3/5
- 32. The Man in the Middle by Gordon Greenidge.** An autobiography **signed** by Greenidge on the title page. There are some stains from what appears to be a spillage on the fep but not

affecting the text or signature. The book is ex-library but both it and the dust jacket are in very good condition, only one neat stamp discovered. Est. £3/5

33. *Boycott by Don Mosey.* A biography covering the career and development of Boycott from early days to 1985, **signed** by Mosey on the title page. The book and dust jacket are in good condition although there is some browning of the pages evident. An interesting read with no punches pulled. Est. £3/5

34. *Wickets, Catches and the Odd Run by Trevor Bailey.* An excellent, entertaining autobiography by Trevor Bailey who has **signed** on the title page. He ranges from early school days, a brief spell as a Marine, his cricket career and the move into broadcasting. The book is in very good condition as is the dust jacket apart from a small tear at the bottom of the spine. Est. £5/8

35. *My Autobiography by Gary Sobers.* **Signed** on the title page "To Ken, Best Wishes". This book always seems to suffer some browning of the pages but that apart is in very good condition. The edges of the dust jacket are a little creased. Est. £5/8

36. *Caught Short of the Boundary by Henry Blofeld,* "and other tall stories" is the sub-title which gives a good idea of the book's contents. **Signed** "Best wishes" by Blofeld on the title page. The book is in very good condition. Est. £3/5

37. *In the Fast Lane by Geoff Boycott.* An account of the 1981 West Indies Tour **signed** by Boycott on the title page. The book and cover are in very good condition. Est. £5/8

38. *Collection of Pin Badges.* Two from the Australian "Ashes Action Pin Collection" (Mike Hussey and Adam Gilchrist); a white golly batsman; a 2cm batsman; a "Castlemaine 4X" Ashes 93; and two 3cm bats inscribed "Lords". Est. £8/12

39. *Twenty Two Plastic 6cm Diameter Badges.* Three Monty Lynch (all different); two England v West Indies 100th Test; three Britannic Assurance "Batting for County Cricket"; three Britannic Assurance "Support Your County Cricket Club"; two Wardy Capped (different); two Surrey Champagne Club, League of Surrey Gentlemen 1991; Caps for three Surrey players 1990; Equity & Law; Equity & Law I Was There, Leicestershire v Middlesex 4.9.98; Surrey C.C.C., two badges from the high scoring Surrey v Lancashire match (different). **Sold with** two smaller (4cm.) Britannic Assurance Championship. All in good condition. Est. £5/8

40. *The Ashes tankard* produced by Franklin Porcelain for the Ashes centenary 1882-1982. Depicts game at the Oval (was the gasometer there in 1882?) in brown and white. W G at the non-striker's end. 'Measures 16 cms in height, 13 cms diameter at base, tapering to 11 cms at the top. Excellent Est. £4/8

41. *Original Punch Cartoons.* Collection of 23 original Punch cartoons, various dates between September 3rd 1919 and August 28th 1935. All black and white, all drawn by Frank Reynolds, 4 full page size, 19 half page size. Good Est. £15/30

42. *Stoneware Mug* by Stonebridge Pottery showing the legend "*Another Six*" beneath a raised design of a batsman and wicketkeeper. Height 3.5". In original box. VG Est. £10/20

43. Sandland Ware Ceramic Tankard. 5” high in cream glaze with gilt detailing to handle and rim. Transfer printed image of the Lord’s Pavilion to the front and Old Father Time to the rear. Some slight discolouration to glaze and wear to gilt detailing. Est. £3/5

44. *Happy Go Johnny.* The autobiography of Johnny Wardle. First Edition 1957, DJ Unclipped. Wardle has **signed**, neatly to the title page, as has his first Yorkshire captain, Brian Sellars, and A.A.Thomson, who was the ghostwriter on the book. Good Est. £25/50

45. *Anything but Murder.* David Lloyd’s autobiographical account of his time as England’s coach. First Edition 2000, DJ Unclipped. Lloyd has **signed** neatly to the title page. VG Est. £10/20

46. *Ken Farnes Diary of an Essex Master.* David Thurlow’s biography of the “little written about” Essex and England fast bowler Ken Farnes. First Edition 2000, DJ Unclipped. Mint Est. £8/12

47. *Alletson’s Innings.* John Arlott’s account of Ted Alletson’s immortal innings of 189 in 90 minutes for Nottinghamshire v Sussex in 1911. 2nd Edition 1958, DJ Unclipped. Some wear to DJ otherwise generally good. Est. £10/20

48. *Allan Border An Autobiography.* First edition 1986, DJ Unclipped. Border has **signed** neatly to the free front end page. Good Est. £10/20

49. Early unbound copies of *The Cricketer* not in the best of condition but good to dip into as you fancy on the long winter nights. The issues are from 1923 Vol. IV Nos. 1-10 and 12-18 1925 Vol. VI No. 25 and 1925 Vol. VI Nos.1-19. Est. £3/5

50. Stamps – Leaders of the World Issue. A beautifully presented set of the stamps issued in 1984 and 1985 by the various British dependencies in the Caribbean. Each pair of stamps shows a head and shoulders image and the named player in action. The Kent and Yorkshire teams of 1984 feature and, as such, many of the individual player stamps feature players from those counties – some who never aspired to ‘Leaders of the World’. The stamps are mounted on the black card seen in stamp albums with a plastic cover with four pairs then mounted on white card. The compiler has provided details at the top of each card of the island of issue, the date and the players’ names. Thirty pairs of stamps. Excellent Est. £8/15

51. Stamps issued to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of West Indies Test cricket and the first overseas Test match tour, 1928. A beautifully presented set of the five stamps issued in 1988 by each of Jamaica, Barbados and Trinidad and Tobago. At least one stamp from each island features a player who played in the inaugural Test match at Lord’s in June 1928. The stamps are mounted on the black card seen in stamp albums with a plastic cover then mounted on white card. The compiler has provided details at the top of the card of the event and the outcome of the match. Enclosed is a printout of the completed scorecard. (It should be noted that the Bajan stamp incorrectly shows H C Griffith, the image being of Lawson Bartlett. Indeed, the Griffith stamp was withdrawn, but some were sold in Bridgetown.) Excellent Est. £6/12

52. Stamps – First Prudential World Cup 1975. A beautifully presented display of stamps issued in 1975 and 1976 by various British dependencies in the Caribbean. The stamps from Antigua and Barbuda (3 from each) feature the team and Viv Richards and Andy Roberts. There are two stamps each from Barbados, Belize, Grenada, Guyana, St Christopher Nevis Anguilla, St Lucia, Dominica, St Vincent, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago. Each of these shows the World Cup trophy on one stamp and a map of the Caribbean with each issuing dependency shown in red. The set is complete. The stamps are mounted on the black card seen in stamp albums with a plastic cover then mounted on white card. The compiler has provided details at the top of the card about the first World Cup. Thirty stamps in total. Excellent Est. £8/15

53. Stamps – India, Pakistan and Bangladesh. (1A) India: an A4 card with a stamp issued on 30 December 1971 to commemorate India's first Test victory over England. The stamp is entitled "Cricket Victories" and the card has a printed copy of the scorecard below the stamp; **(1B)** an A4 card with a stamp issued on 27 September 1973 – the 100th anniversary of the birth of Ranjitsinhji (1872-1933). Below the stamp are details of Ranji's cricketing career; **(1C)** an A4 card with four stamps issued on 13 March 1996 featuring famous Indian cricketers – Nayudu, Mankad, Merchant and Deodhar. **(2A)** Pakistan: an A4 card showing four stamps issued on 14 August 1962 featuring Sports of Pakistan – football, hockey, squash and cricket – one on each stamp; **(2B)** a set of three stamps issued on 27 April 1992 to celebrate Pakistan's World Cup victory. Mounted on A4 card, there is a description of the B&H Cup of that year and the scorecard from the final; **(2C)** a set of three stamps issued on 5 July 1992 to celebrate National Industries. One of the stamps shows sports goods, including a bat, ball and stumps. **(3)** a set of three stamps issued on 27 November 1988 to commemorate the Asia Cricket Cup 1988-89 being held in Bangladesh, an event involving India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh. There are three stamps – the left one shows a bowler, the middle, a batsman and the right, a wicketkeeper. Each set is mounted on A4 card, beautifully presented, with appropriate text. Excellent

54. Stamps – Australian/Australian connection. (1) a set of six stamps issued on 9 March 1977 to commemorate the Centenary Test. There is a set of five stamps which depict a cricket scene running from (l-r) a wicketkeeper, batsman, fielders, non-striker and bowler; the sixth stamp features a batsman facing. Below are some details of the match and the scorecard. There is a separate sheet with a reproduction of the complete scorecard; **(2)** a single stamp issued on 18 February 1981 depicting a caricature of Victor Trumper. It was part of a set entitled 'Sports Personalities'. Below the stamp are details of his cricketing career; **(3)** three stamps on A4 card, one being the cricket stamp from Sporting Activities 1989, the other two being issued in 1992 to commemorate 100 Years of the Sheffield Shield competition with details about it; **(4)** a block of ten identical stamps, with edging, depicting Don Bradman, a head and shoulders image to the left of each and Bradman playing a shot in the right hand stamp AND another card with just the stamps without edging; **(5)** to commemorate Bradman's death in 2001, the same stamps were reissued with '1908 – 2001' added. There are two stamps plus edging and a first day cover with the stamps postmarked 'Bowral NSW 13 March 2001'; **(6)** issued in Grenada, six sheets of the 'Shane Warne Collection'. Each sheet has its own title and there are 44 stamps in total in a presentation pack. Every item is excellent

55. Stamps – New Zealand. (1) an A4 card of the Children's Health stamps issued on 21 June 1995. The set comprises four triangular stamps, none of which depict cricket, but the set was issued in a mount which includes a boy batting; **(2) on an A4 card,** a stamp issued on 17

February 1993 entitled 'State Housing'. The stamp was part of a larger set, this one being the only one depicting a cricket scene; (3) mounted on an A4 card, stamps issued in 1992 and titled 'New Zealand Sporting Heroes'. A set of four stamps, two of which show C S Dempster, below which is a block of text about Dempster and below that another two stamps of the set; (4) an A4 card showing a series of stamps issued on 2 November 1994 to celebrate the Centenary of the New Zealand Cricket Council. The block comprises ten stamps (five above five) which combine to show summer on the beach with many families playing beach cricket; (5) an A4 card with one stamp issued on 4 October 1995 with the title 'Famous New Zealanders: Sir Richard Hadlee, cricketer', below which is a block of text about Hadlee's cricket career; (6) an A4 card with a set of four stamps issued on 2 November 1994 to commemorate the Centenary of New Zealand Cricket 1895 – 1995. The four stamps each show an unidentified cricketer batting, bowling, keeping wicket and taking a catch, below which is a block of text giving a brief history of New Zealand cricket. Every item is excellent. Est. £8/12

56. Stamps – Caribbean. (1) an A4 card celebrating Barbados Independence in 1966. With four stamps, one being the first stamp to show an actual cricketer (Gary Sobers) on it. With two stamps, top and bottom, there is a block of text about Sobers' cricket career; (2) an A4 card with three Guyana stamps issued on 8 February 1968 for the 9th MCC tour to the West Indies in 1967-68. The three stamps feature (l-r) a wicketkeeper, a batsman and a bowler, beneath which there is a block of text about the tour. On the back of the card is scorecard for the 4th Test in Trinidad; (3) an A4 card at the top of which are the three stamps issued by Jamaica for the same event – and with the same image - as (2) above. Below are two stamps issued by St Lucia on 8 March 1968 for the same event, but with different images; (4) an A4 card with four stamps issued by Grenada titled 'cricket'. Each shows an unidentified cricketer and the stamp edging shows a bat and a pad. Below the stamps is a small block of text; (5) an A4 card with three stamps in a surround issued by Antigua on 15 December 1972 to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Rising Sun CC. Below the stamps is a block of text, mentioning that both Viv Richards and Andy Roberts began their careers at the club. Below the text the three stamps are displayed horizontally; (6) an A4 card with four stamps issued by Bermuda on 16 August 1976 for the 75th Anniversary of the cup match between Somerset and St George's. Three of the stamps illustrate the grounds, whilst the fourth shows the cup. A text box below provides details of the clubs and the stamps; (7) an A4 card with stamps issued by Guyana on 7 November 1985 to celebrate Clive Lloyd's Testimonial Year. There are seven stamps, one large, 3 smaller and three even smaller. Both sets of three have the same images. The text box below gives details of Lloyd's career; (8) an A4 card with two stamps issued by St Kitts on 13 July 1988 to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the Leeward Island Cricket Tournament. The text box below gives details of the images on each stamp; (9) an A4 card with one stamp in a larger block, all part of a cricket scene, issued by Barbados on 20 November 1991 to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of Independence. Small text box below; (10) a card from a stamp album containing – on both sides – panels containing a stamp, plus other related stamps issued in various dependencies to welcome the Cricket World Cup 2007. The panels are from Jamaica, Montserrat, Nevis, Trinidad and Tobago, Dominica, Grenada and Guyana. The accompanying stamps are two from Montserrat, three from St Lucia and three from Grenada. Every item is excellent Est. £12/18

57. Two Commemorative Covers for the Lord's Test Match against New Zealand 1990. One is **signed** by Glenn Turner and John Wright, **the other** by Richard Hadlee. Both covers are in very good condition with clear signatures. Est. £5/8

58. Commemorative Cover celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the Lord's Taverners. The cover is **signed** by Trevor Bailey, Bob Wyatt, Geoff Boycott, Colin Cowdrey, Alec Bedser and Godfrey Evans. The cover is in very good condition with excellent signatures. Est. £8/12

59. Benham Cover Celebrating Border Becoming the Highest Scoring Test Cricketer 1993. The cover is **signed** by Border and has an additional New Zealand stamp postmarked Christchurch where he broke the record. The cover is in very good condition with a clear signature. Est. £5/8
