Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two auctions in the year - March and October.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders the week after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyers premium!

- 1. Bookends** One end is a bat, the other stumps and a ball. Made of wood and in very good condition. Est. £5/8
- 2. A Golly Batsman** from Carlton Ware wearing a blue shirt, red trousers, black boots and pads. It is holding a bat with a ball on the face. Marked as 65/1250 on the base. 22cms tall and in very good condition. Est. £12/15
- 3. “Things to Come” by Christine Haworth.** A young child sitting on a picnic basket against which is leaning a cricket bat, he is holding a cricket ball. 11cms high and in very good condition. Est. £8/10
- 4. Model of Dog Batsman** wearing a red shirt, blue trousers, a yellow helmet and brown pads and boots. He is holding a bat and there is a ball on the base. 9cms high and in very good condition. The model was handmade for “Sculptures”. Est. £5/8
- 5. Model of Duck** on the beach wearing a dark blue shirt and holding a light blue cricket bat over his shoulder. His head is sprung. 9.5cms high and in very good condition. Est. £5/8
- 6. “Kiwi Folk” Batsman Model** wearing grey, the original New Zealand “one day” colours. He is holding his bat aloft. 7cms tall in very good condition. Est. £8/10

16. Cyril Washbrook, Famous Cricketers Series signed by Washbrook and his opening partners Hutton, Simpson and Place. The booklet is in excellent condition. Est. £15/20

17. Brian Lara. A first day cover postmarked April 18th1994, St. John's, Antigua & Barbuda, issued to celebrate Brian Lara's record score of 375. Re-stamped with an Edgbaston stamp celebrating his score of 501, 6th June 1994. The cover is in excellent condition and is **signed** by Lara. Est. £10/15

18. Dr. W.G. Grace Centenary Souvenir Booklet. A booklet produced to celebrate the centenary of the birth of Grace in 1848 **signed** by ten players who represented Gloucestershire in the "Grace Centenary Match" v Derbyshire at Bristol 14th, 15th and 16th July 1948. The signatories are Allen, Lambert, Goddard, Emmett, Hale, Cranfield, Cook, Wilson, Scott and Graveney (T.W.). Barnett is missing from the signatures but Graveney (J.K.R.) has also signed. An excellent copy of the brochure which is **almost fully signed** by all the players taking part. **A remarkable item which will become a real collector's piece in years to come. A rather sad letter in reply to a request for memorabilia but a good signature from a notable Derbyshire cricketer from the thirties who went on to play a significant coaching role in New Zealand. It is ironic that he apologises for his handwriting which is more legible than that of a good many of today's players. Est. £10/15

22. Signatures from 1990, 1991 and 1992. A file containing in the order of 1743 signatures on A4 card identified by the appropriate county badge. Each card is accompanied by a photocopied sheet on which the signatures are identified and the year of collection shown. In addition to the sheets from each County there are three International teams, Sri Lanka, West Indies and Pakistan collected in the same period amounting to 55 signatures. A truly remarkable collection of autographs which needs to be seen to be appreciated. Est. £200/250

We are privileged to have been asked to auction some of the personal collection of Mrs Anne Courbet who enjoyed a long connection with Warwickshire County Cricket Club from 1951 when she joined the office staff at Edgbaston under the overall control of Lesley Deakins and subsequently supported the administration of the Old Players Society together with Deakins. She was a prolific letter writer and maintained contact with players and their wives over the years. (Lots 36-47)

36. Warwickshire County Cricket Club, A History by Egdell and Fraser. A very good copy of the history written by two local journalists and published by Cornish in 1946. This copy was inscribed and presented to George Austin, the county scorer, by the President of the club, Dr. Harold Thwaite in June 1946 in recognition of his “many years of faithful service”. “Chico”, as he was known, was scorer for 53 years and prior to that was a junior office boy. He is mentioned, with affection, in Jack Bannister’s history. Est. £20/25

37. Who’s Who of Warwickshire Cricketers 1894-1939 by Steven Sheen. A comprehensive record in excellent condition with similar dust jacket published in 2019 by the Author. Est. £10/15

38. History of Warwickshire County Cricket Club by Jack Bannister (Helm series). An excellent copy of the book neatly signed and dedicated by Bannister “To Anne, With happy memories of good and exciting times at Edgbaston over 30 years ago with L.T.D.” Est. £3/5

40. Warwickshire Scorecards A batch of completed cards for home matches of the Championship winning 1951 season. The cards are in very good condition. A total of eighteen cards. Probably a scarce collection these days. Est. £25/30

41. Menu of Dinner in Honour of Warwickshire on their winning of the 1951 County Championship. The dinner was given by Lord Iliffe in his capacity as a Birmingham Newspaper Magnate and held in the Grand Hotel, Birmingham. At that time the dinner would have been for men only but Lord Iliffe extended an invitation to the player’s wives and the female office staff but they would have to eat at tables on the balcony overlooking the dining room. A copy of this invitation and the seating arrangements for the ladies is included. The menu is in very good condition with only a few marks on the front cover. Est. £15/20

42. England v West Indies Scorecard and two press tickets for the 1st Test at Edgbaston 1957. Also included is the flyer for members containing an application form for tickets and instructions for attendance. **Sold with** a page from The Birmingham Mail of April 22nd reviewing the forthcoming season and the first Test Match to be held at Edgbaston for twenty-eight years, the programme for the Sportsmen’s Service held on the Sunday of the Test at St. Mary & St. Ambrose Church, Edgbaston. The newspaper cuttings are sixty-five years old and as such a little fragile but complete. Est. £12/15

43. Warwickshire County Champions 1951. A collection of newspaper articles celebrating the first Championship since 1911. The cuttings are in very good condition for their age and show how important the success was in the county. Est. £12/15

44. Bob Wyatt. A paperweight enclosing a signed photograph of Bob Wyatt. The lot includes a copy of the letter to Wyatt which accompanied his copy of the paperweight and his letter of thanks. **Sold with** a letter from Wyatt sent after his operation asking for his thanks to be conveyed to all the members of the Warwickshire Old County Cricketers Association who had sent him best wishes.
